

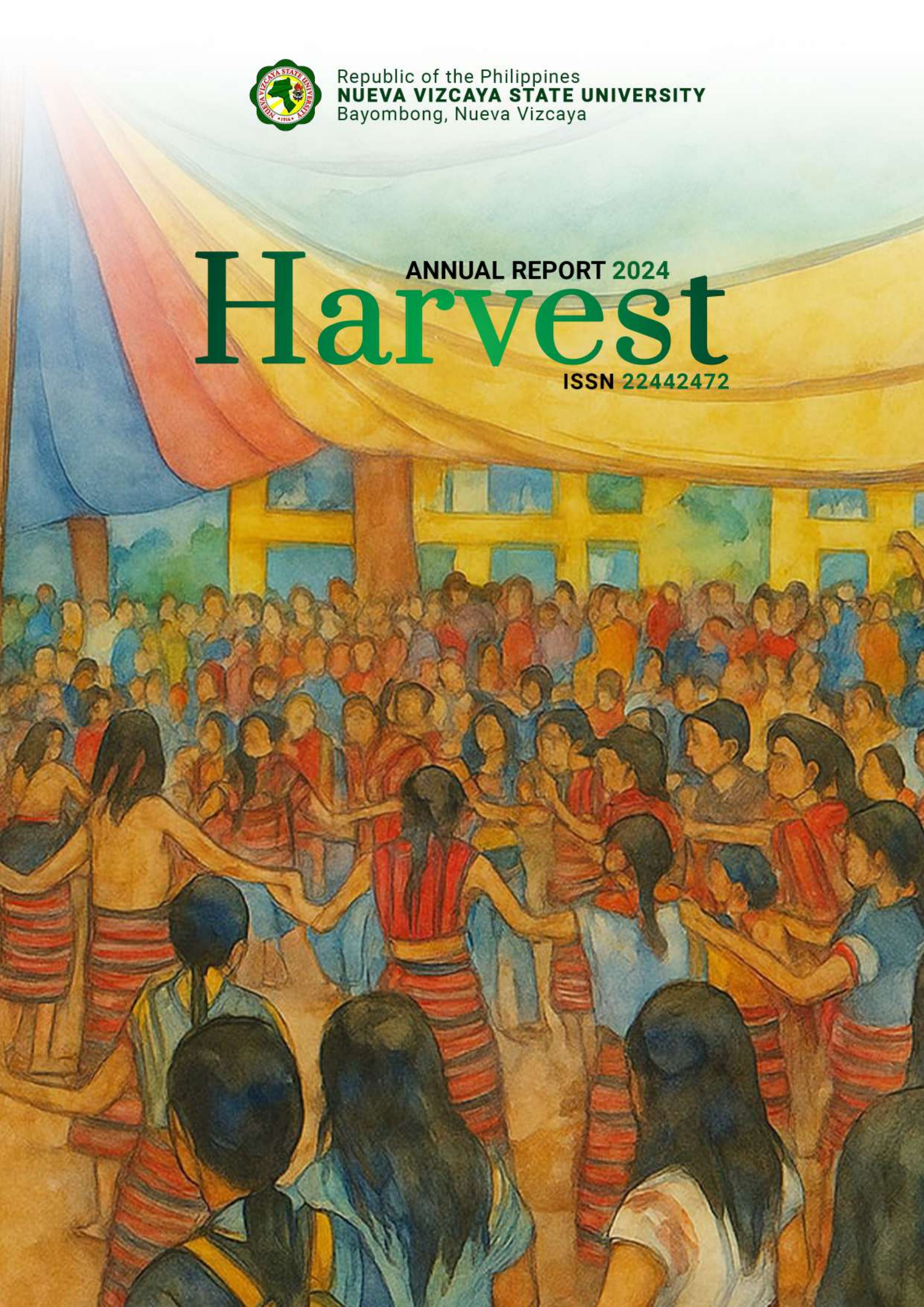


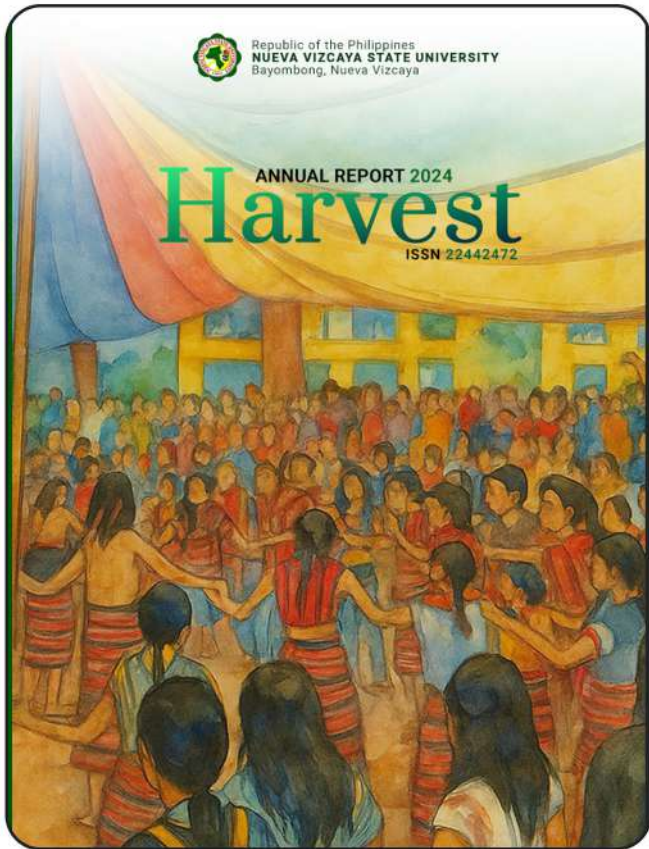

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Nueva Vizcaya State University marked a year of strong institutional performance across instruction, research, innovation, global collaboration, and human development. These achievements reflect the university's deep commitment to inclusive education, science-driven progress, and meaningful public service.

During the academic year, NVSU accepted 13,856 students into various degree programs. This continued expansion of access to higher education affirms the university's role in shaping future-ready professionals and leaders.

A total of 1,980 students completed their academic requirements and received their degrees. This milestone highlights the university's strong focus on student success and the effective delivery of academic programs aligned with national standards and global relevance.

The university also produced 921 newly licensed professionals, a result of strong faculty mentorship and a solid academic foundation. Two graduates earned national recognition by placing among the top examinees: Top 1 in the Geodetic Engineer Licensure Examination and Top 4 in the Agricultural and Biosystems Engineers Licensure Examination. These achievements validate the quality of NVSU's academic offerings, including 57 AACUP-accredited programs across disciplines.

In research and development, NVSU mobilized ₱68 million worth of R&D resources. Faculty researchers actively contributed to scientific advancement through 12 research centers, with a total of 171 papers presented at various academic platforms. The university also secured 38 registered intellectual properties, reflecting its commitment to protect and promote original and innovative outputs.

NVSU identified 14 technologies ready for commercialization, covering five key sectors: six in food technology, three in metal technology, three in agricultural technology, one in electrical energy, and one in renewable energy. These technologies offer practical solutions to local and national challenges, advancing the university's goal of transforming knowledge into accessible and impactful products and services.

Extension programs reached 2,680 individuals and organizations, supporting community needs through technical services, skills development, and applied knowledge transfer. These engagements highlight NVSU's role as an enabler of grassroots growth and innovation.

On the global stage, NVSU established 17 international partnerships and linkages with academic institutions and development agencies. These collaborations strengthened its internationalization agenda and opened opportunities for student and faculty mobility, research exchange, and global cooperation. The university received recognition as First Runner-Up in the Global Citizenships Award, affirming its role as a globally connected and socially responsible institution.

Institutional development continued through 35 completed infrastructure projects, while 20 projects remain in progress to address growing academic and operational needs. NVSU enhanced its workforce capacity with 308 faculty and staff appointed, promoted, or reclassified, ensuring stronger support systems across instruction, research, and administration.

This year also marked NVSU's first entry into the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings, a significant step toward institutional sustainability and environmental stewardship. The university also advanced in the WURI 2024 rankings, placing 154th worldwide, and securing competitive positions in the categories of Culture and Values (26th), Leadership (43rd), and Social Responsibility (44th).

To promote health and productivity within the university, NVSU introduced NVSU HATAW, a wellness initiative that encourages regular physical activity among students and employees. This program forms part of the university's broader effort to ensure holistic development and work-life balance in the academic environment.


These milestones collectively demonstrate NVSU's continuing pursuit of excellence in higher education, its readiness to respond to emerging challenges, and its commitment to building a globally engaged, research-driven, and socially responsive academic institution.

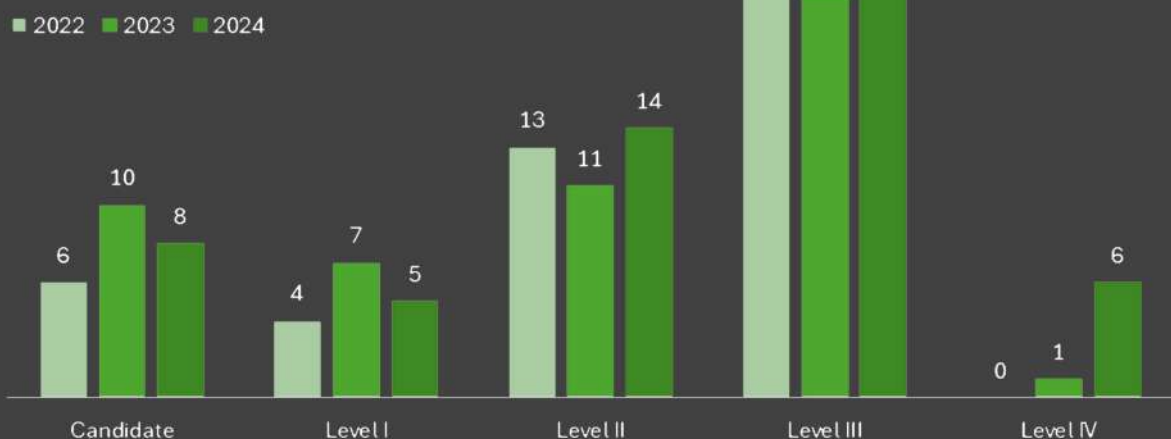

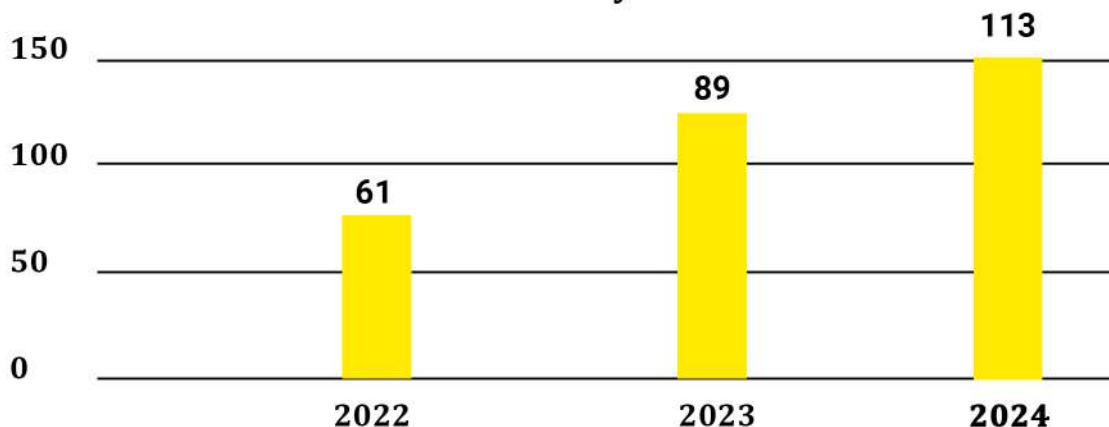
Trends by Level: 2022-2024 Performance Overview

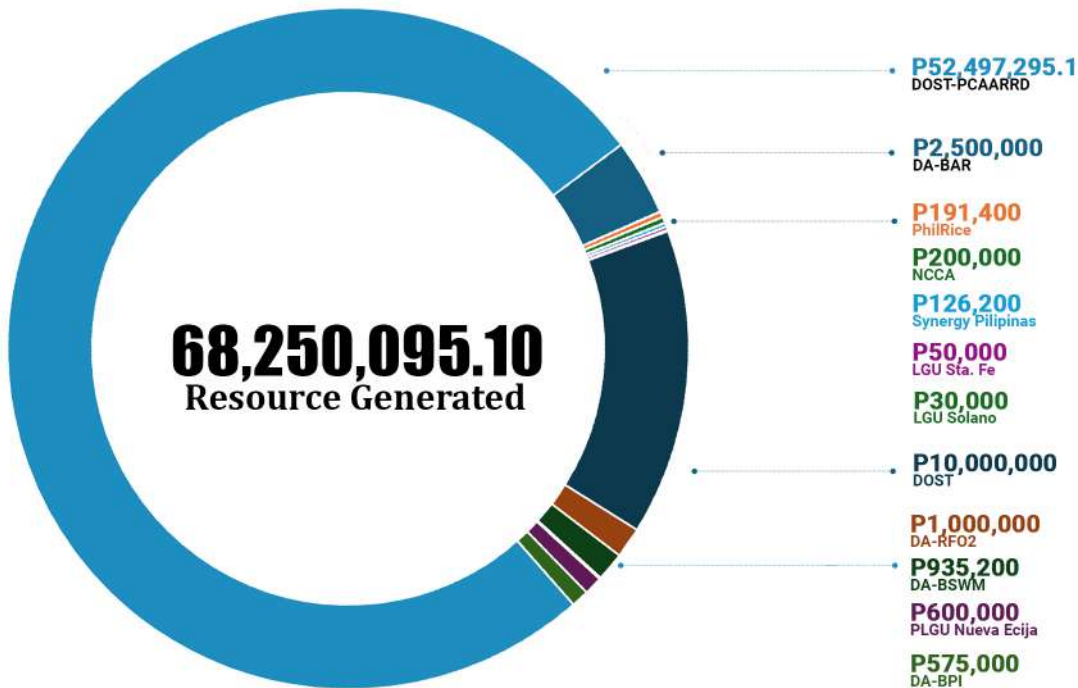

Financial Resources Generated for R&D Implementation

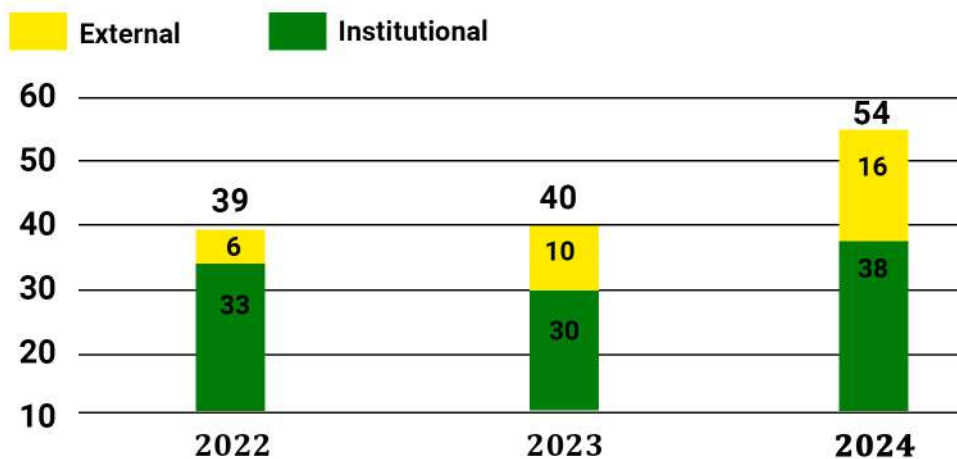

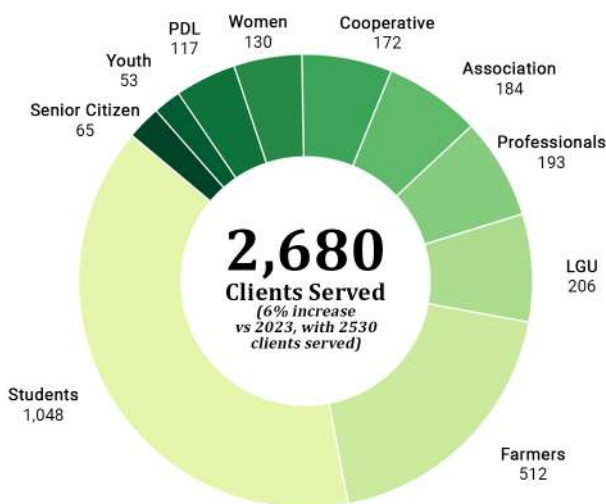
NVSU's extension and training services expanded from 2022 to 2024. The university showed a strong commitment to community engagement and sustainable development initiatives.

Number and Type of Client Served, and Training Conducted

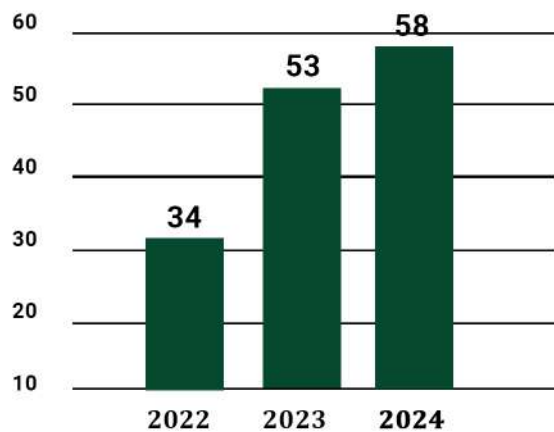
The number of clients served rose from 2,530 in 2023 to 2,680 in 2024. This marked a 6% increase and showed the wider reach of NVSU's extension efforts.

Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) made history as the first in Region 2 to win major honors at the 2024 NSAARRD, cementing its status as a national leader in agricultural research. The recognition was given during PCAARRD's 52nd anniversary at the PICC on November 8, 2024.

TISSUE CULTURE AND MACRO-PROPAGATION OF SABA: CAGAYAN VALLEY'S PLANTING MATERIAL SUPPORT SYSTEM FOR BANANA

Disease-free 'Saba' plantlets were produced using tissue culture and macropropagation technologies at NVSU, QSU, and CVRC.

Led by Dr. Elbert A. Sana, the NVSU project "Tissue Culture and Macropropagation of Saba" aims to curb disease spread from infected suckers and delayed plant removal. The project scaled up plantlet production, giving farmers better access to quality planting materials—crucial for improving smallholder banana farming.

This project develops eco-friendly fungicides from fungi to combat Tomato Black Leaf Mold, offering a safer alternative to chemical pesticides. It helps farmers boost crop yields and profits while promoting sustainable agriculture and healthier ecosystems. The study also educates local farmers on these innovations, advancing biocontrol technology and showcasing the potential of biotechnology in improving crop health, profitability, and environmental stewardship.

NVSU SABATAN & IPTBM

Established on September 1, 2019, Sabatan Technopreneurs Hub serves as NVSU's official Technology Business Incubator, supporting early-stage startups in advanced technologies and sustainable innovations. It promotes growth in agriculture, manufacturing, and MSMEs through mentorship, boot camps, hackathon, and investment linkages.

The IP-TBM Office, launched in 2018 and institutionalized in 2020 through DOST-PCAARRD, oversees IP management and the commercialization of government-funded R&D. Its operations include the Innovation and Technology Support Office (ITSO), established in partnership with IPOPHL, which handles IP protection, training, and portfolio management. The office facilitates technology transfer through licensing, spin-offs, and royalty agreements.

A key highlight of NVSU's Technology Transfer Week was the signing of a Technology Licensing Agreement (TLA) with the Agrizcaya Cooperative Federation. The agreement, signed by President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. and General Manager Eden D. Lacar, grants Agrizcaya a non-exclusive, transferable three-year license to adopt and commercialize the technology "A Process of Making Fish Cream Soup/Composition" within Nueva Vizcaya. The TLA was finalized with the assistance of DOST-R02 through a Fairness Opinion Board (FOB) evaluation.



NVSU Sabatan is the Nueva Vizcaya State University's Technology Business Incubator (TBI) hub. It's an Ilocano term meaning "meeting place," and serves as a central location for fostering innovation and entrepreneurial ventures. The hub aims to help convert innovative ideas into successful businesses, aligning with NVSU's mission to develop an empowered and productive citizenry.

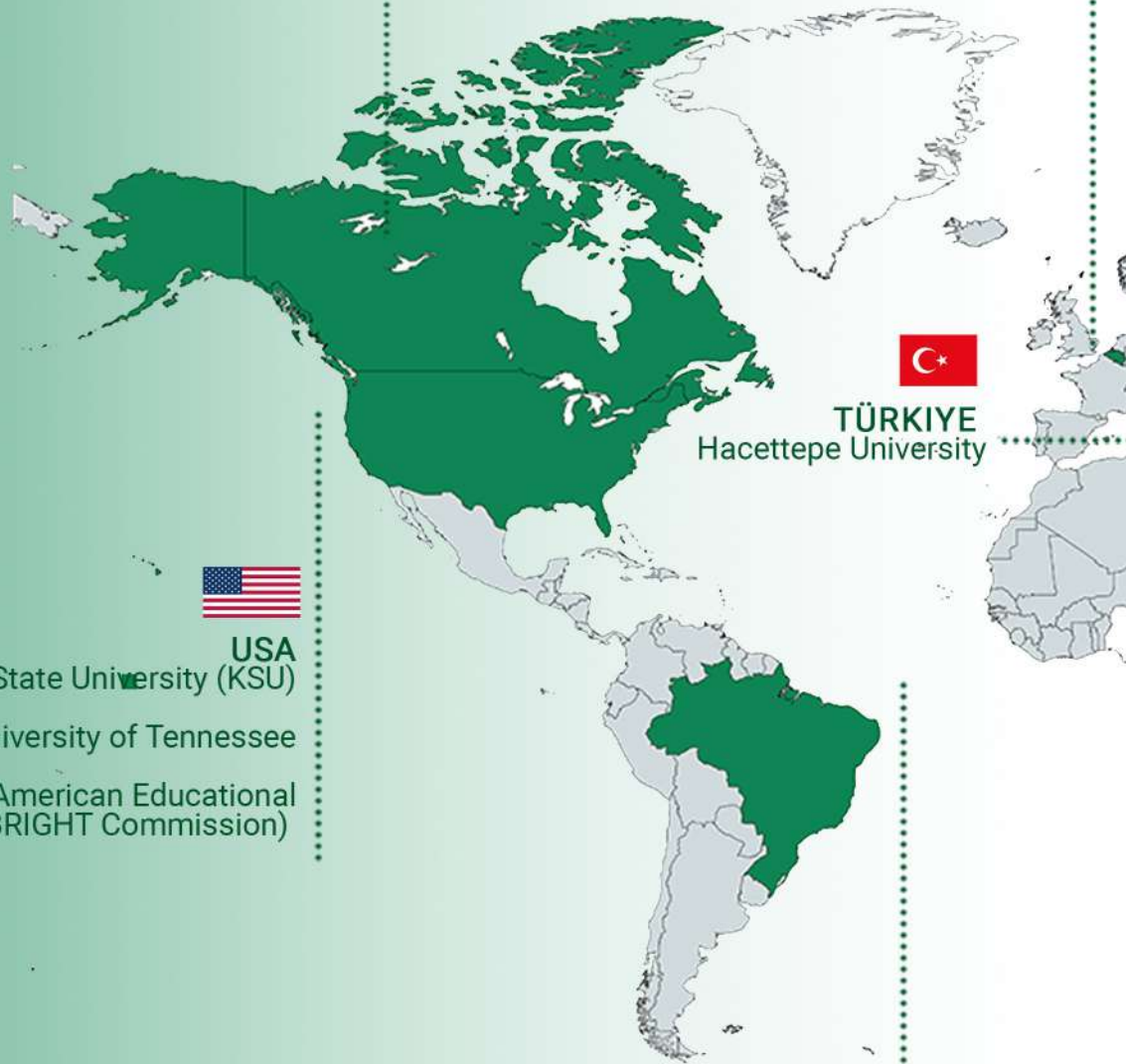

Strengthening Global Connections: NVSU, Mie University Ink MOU for Academic, Research Collaboration

Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) and Mie University, Japan, have formalized a partnership to enhance academic and research opportunities through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), at the Board Room of the New Administration Building, NVSU, December 13, 2024

University President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. warmly welcomed the delegation from Mie University and expressed optimism about the partnership’s potential.

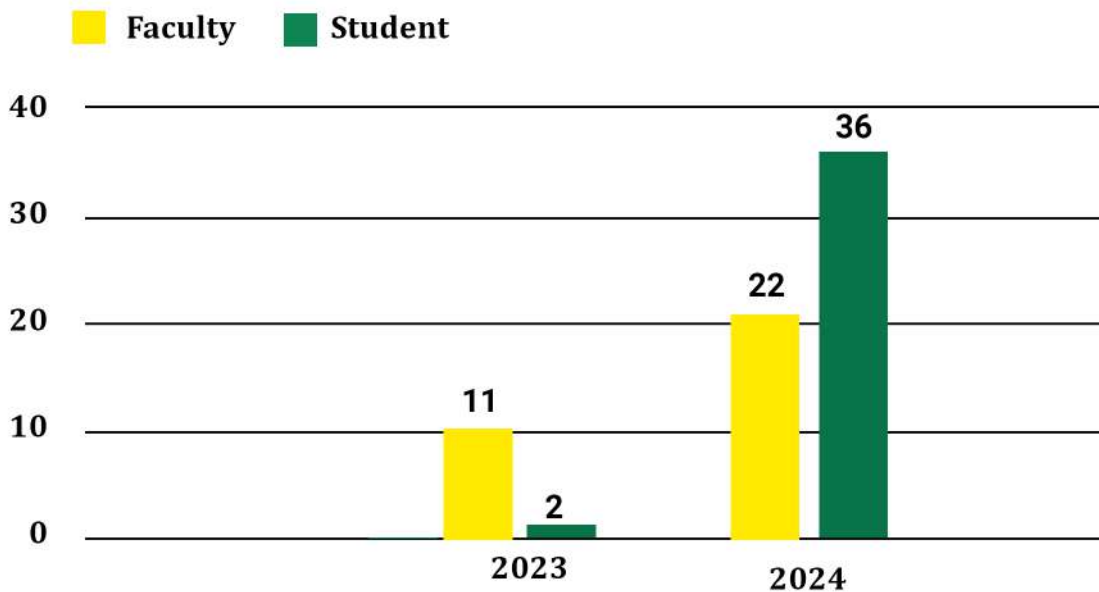

In 2024, NVSU sent six technical interns to Japan through its partnership with the Organization for Industrial, Spiritual and Cultural Advancement (OISCA). The collaboration, formalized in February 2023 by University President Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. and OISCA Secretary General Yasuaki Nagaishi, promotes sustainable development, cultural exchange, and practical training opportunities.

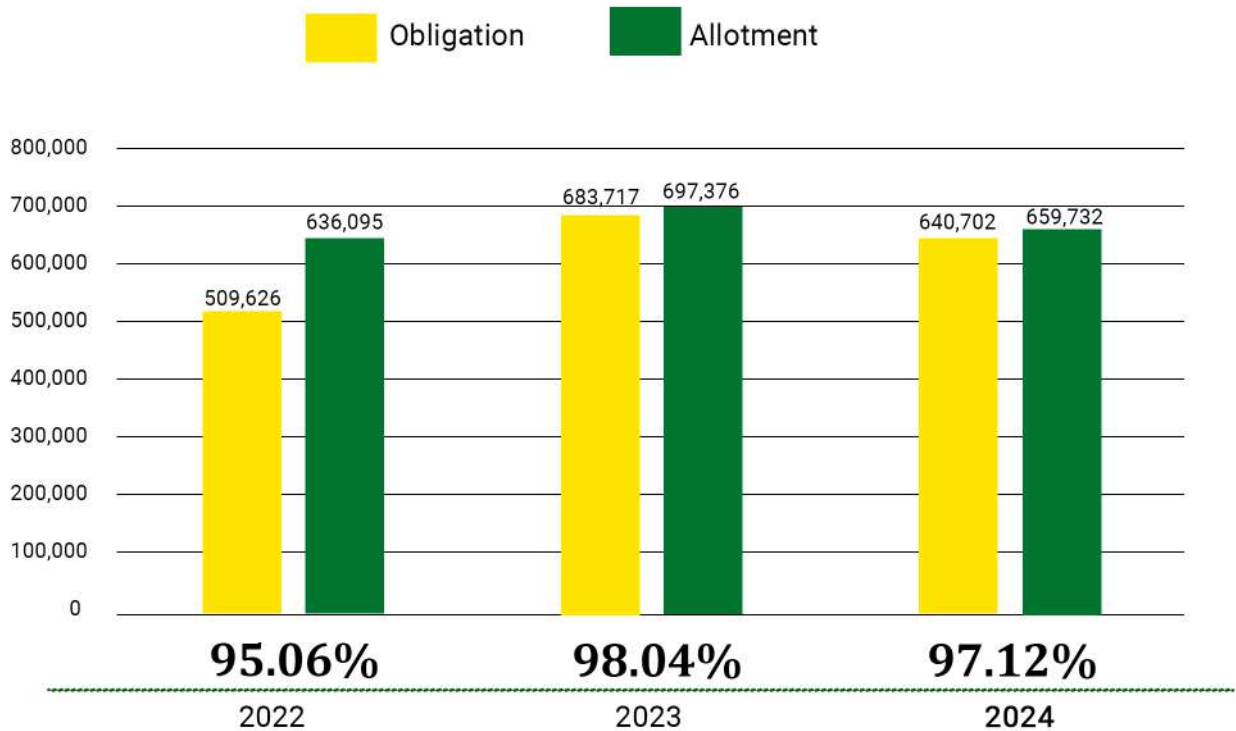

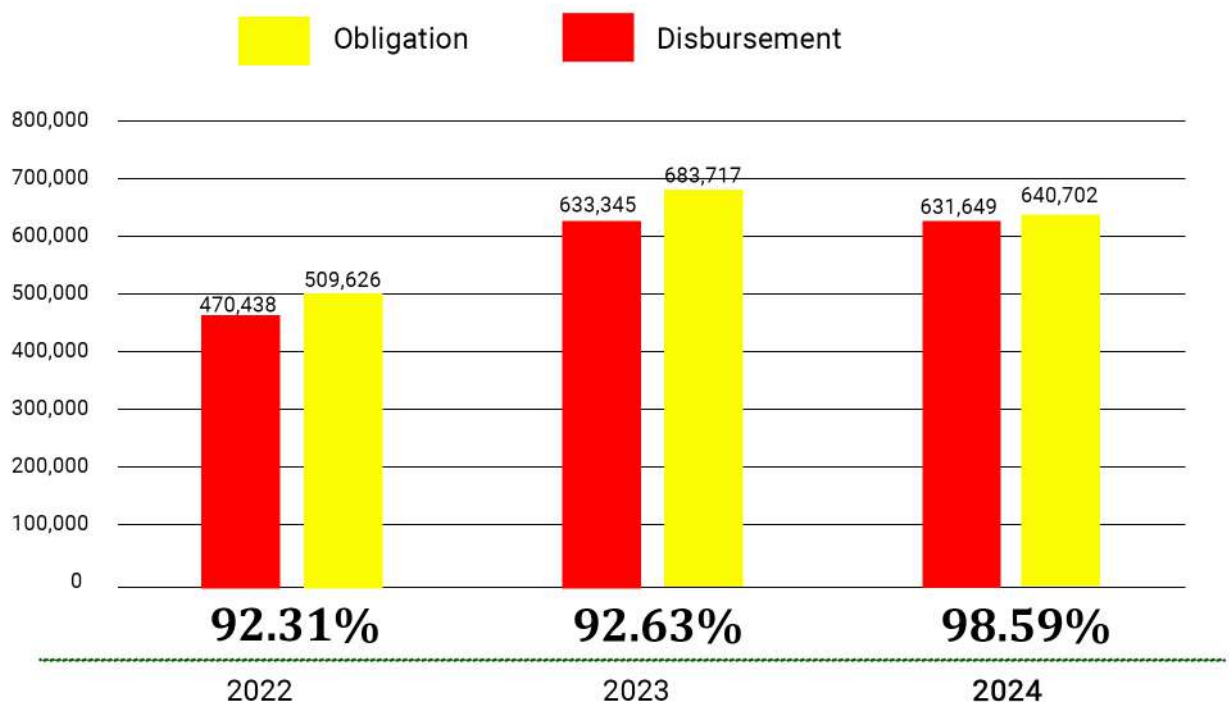

Obligation Rate



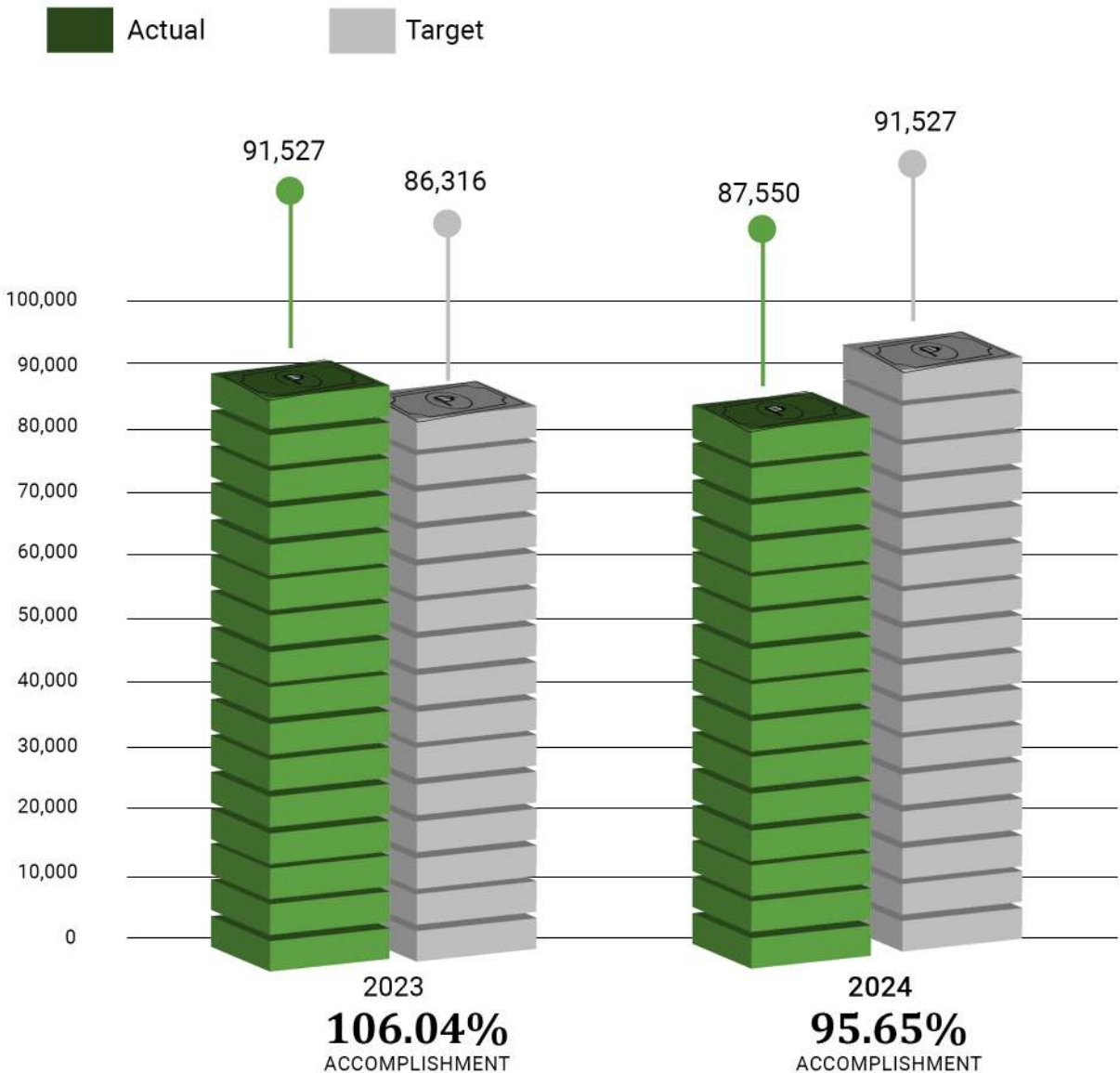
Disbursement Rate



2024 Income Performance

The university demonstrated commendable income performance in both 2023 and 2024. In 2023, actual income reached ₱91,527,000, surpassing the target of ₱86,316,000, which translates to an accomplishment rate of 106.04%. This indicates strong performance in generating revenues beyond projections.

For 2024, the actual income was ₱87,550,000, slightly below the target of ₱91,527,000, resulting in an accomplishment rate of 95.65%. While this reflects a slight shortfall, the university still maintained a high income realization rate, demonstrating continued financial stability.



Note: All values for obligation, disbursement, income performance are presented in thousand pesos (₱'000), equivalent to millions of pesos in actual value.

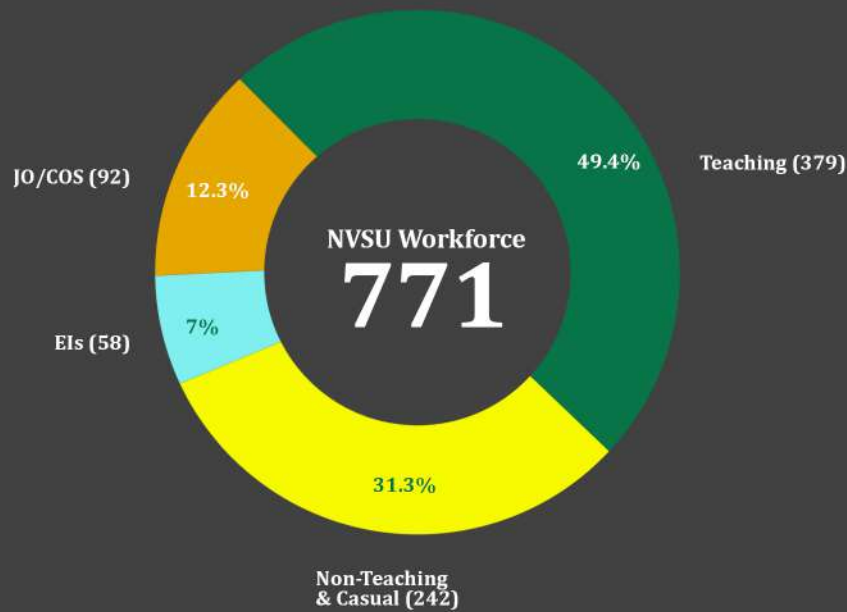
Human Resource

NVSU has 771 personnel: 49.4% are teaching, 31.3% non-teaching & casual, 12.3% JO/COS, and 7% EIs.

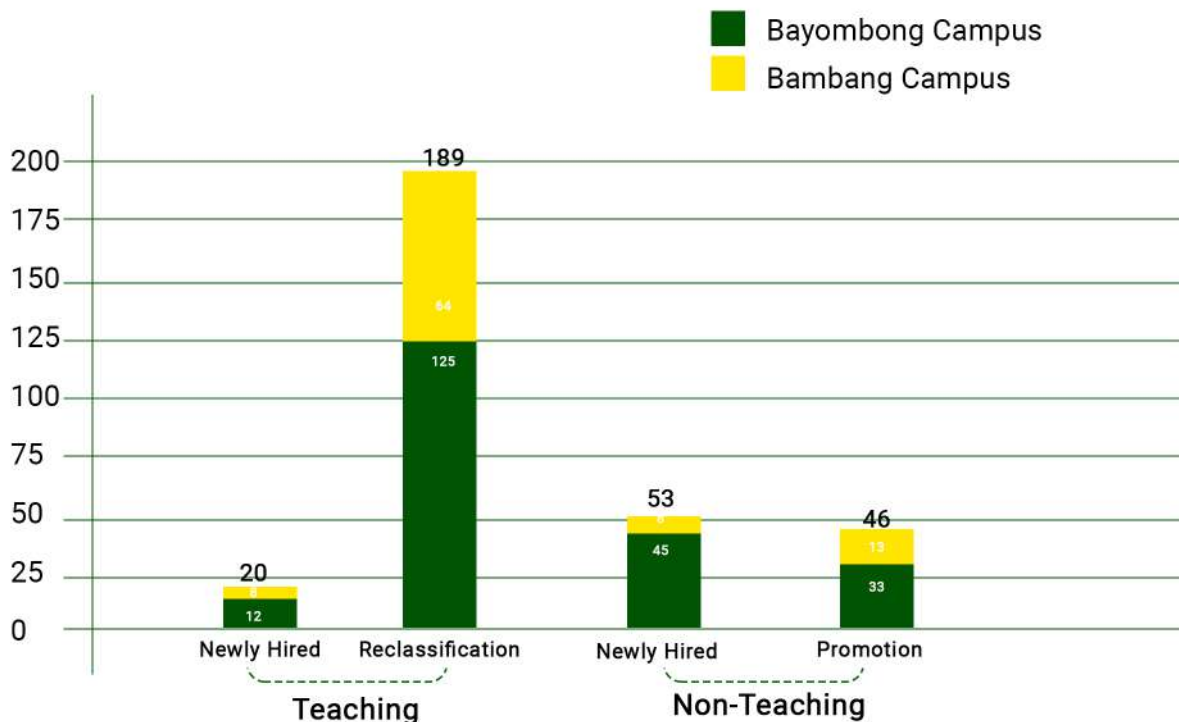

Filled Positions/Movement



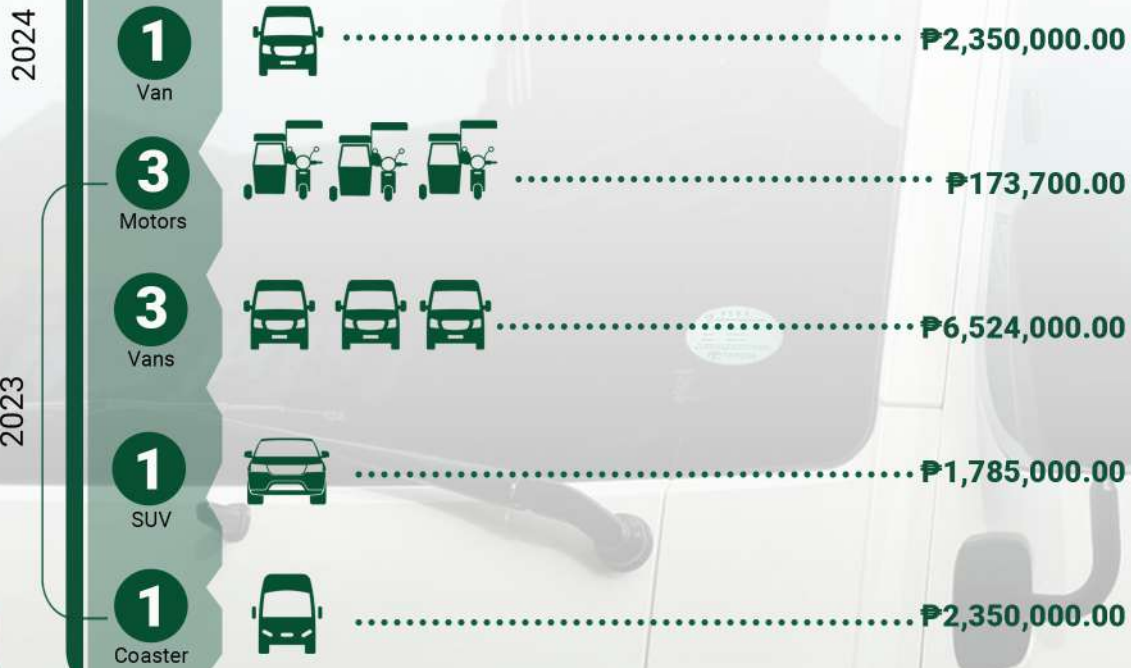

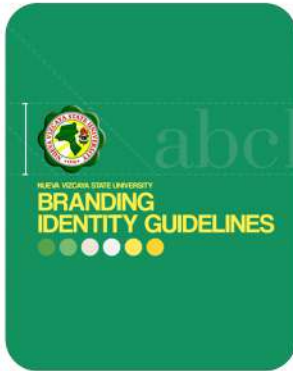

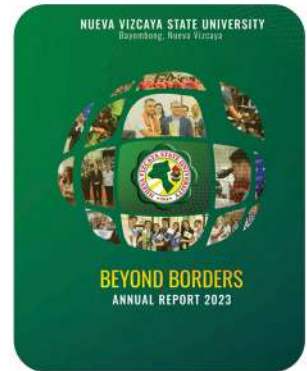

The Nueva Vizcaya State University is the result of the merger of the Nueva Vizcaya State Institute of Technology (NVSIT) and the Nueva Vizcaya State Polytechnic College (NVSPC). The two schools were the two biggest state-run colleges in the province of Nueva Vizcaya. The NVSIT has a total area of 148.5 hectares situated at the foot of the scenic Bangan Hill in Bayombong, the capital town of the province. The NVSPC on the other hand, has an area of 14.21 hectares in Bambang.

The NVSIT started as a farm settlement school in 1916 offering only intermediate curriculum. Two years after, a secondary curriculum was added to its former program, later renaming the school as the Bayombong Rural School, then as the Nueva Vizcaya Rural High School (NVRHS) in 1930.

However, school operations in the country were suddenly stopped because of the war with the Japanese forces in 1941. After the war, NVRHS resumed its operation in 1945 but it was split into two entities: the NVRHS (now the NVSU) and the other as the Nueva Vizcaya High School (now the Nueva Vizcaya General Comprehensive High School).

During the post-war years, businesses started to boom in Bambang which paved the way for an educational institution to cater to the growing population of the municipality. As a result, the Municipality Council of Bambang passed a resolution on July 11, 1946 for the establishment of a Junior High School in the southern part of the province. With the intensified campaigns of raising funds for the proposed school, the amount of Php 19,720.00 was accumulated. Through this initial fund, the JHS was constructed. In the same month, the Southern Nueva Vizcaya Junior High School (SNVJHS) formally started its operation. A year later, it was renamed as the Bambang High School (BHS).

Both NVRHS and BHS had undergone remarkable transformations geared toward betterment, responsive to a dynamic civilization. Development in terms of physical facilities, manpower and system of education were given top considerations. With the strong support of political leaders of the province led by then Congressman Leonardo Perez, the upgrading of the different sectors of each respective district especially the educational component was realized. The NVRHS was converted into Nueva Vizcaya National Agricultural School (NVNAS) in 1956, made possible by virtue of Republic Act 1580 sponsored by Cong. Perez. In 1964, another conversion took place when the NVNAS was changed into Nueva Vizcaya Agricultural College (NVAC) through the legislation of R.A 4055, also authored by Cong. Perez. He likewise sponsored R.A 1971 converting the BHS into the Nueva Vizcaya School of Arts and Trades (NVSAT) on June 22, 1957.

The NVAC marker is a historical emblem built at the left wing of the façade leading to the Administration building of the Bayombong campus. The unveiling of the NVAC marker was held on June 18, 1965 with then Hon. Senator Leonardo Perez. Eventually on May 22, 1973, NVAC was converted to NVSIT by virtue of Presidential Decree 196. With the increasing clamor for more degree courses, NVSIT responded and provided expansions of its course offerings. Initially, the courses offered were basically agriculture and related fields.

Similarly, the NVSAT in Bambang was converted into NVSPC in June 1983 by force of Batas Pambansa Blg. 495 authored by Hon. Perez and Hon. Carlos Padilla.

Both NVSIT and NVSPC have distinct areas of excellence catering quality education to Novo Vizcayanos, those coming from neighboring provinces and other parts of the country. It was then reckoned that the merging of the two campuses would strengthen the pursuit for quality education. The goal of becoming a single institution with a university status was made possible through the collaborative efforts of all officials of both campuses and the imposing support from the political heads of the province.

A Technical Working Group (TWG) was organized to conduct a feasibility study on the merging of the two campuses and this was initiated by then Hon. Cong. Padilla. The key officials of both campuses made up the TWG and had their initial meeting on July 13, 2001. The establishment of NVSU was steered by the constitutional mandate as stated in Sec. 2 paragraph 1 of Article XIV and in Batas Pambansa Blg. 2232 (Education Act of 1982) that "the state shall establish, maintain, and support a

complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of the people and of society."

The passing of House Bill No. 2232 (An Act Constituting the Merging of the Two Campuses into NVSU) authored by Hon. Padilla was a big leap in the history of both campuses. Eventually, the painstaking bid for university status was over when R.A 9272 lapsed into law on March 20, 2004.

Finally, after the two-year search for NVSU President, Dr. Marilou Gilo- Abon was pronounced by the Board of Regents as the first University President on May 31, 2005. Dr. Abon was the former Vice President for Academic Affairs and concurrently dean of the College of Arts and Sciences of the Central Luzon State University. With her leadership, she yearned not only for NVSU to aim for a culture of excellence but also to advocate a culture of peace which should be the supreme advocacy of a country that is in political turmoil. Indeed, academic institution plays a vital role in the molding of citizens of this nation; thus, NVSU stands steadfast with its advocacy.

After four years of fruitful administration, Dr. Abon was re-appointed by the members of the Board of Regents for a second term. However, the flourishing university was in mourning with the untimely demise of Dr. Abon on April 23, 2010. The gargantuan task left by the Abon leadership was taken over by Dr. Romeo S. Quilang, President of the Isabela State University, as officer in-charge (OIC) through BOR Resolution No. 68 s. 2010 which took effect on April 26, 2010. Nevertheless, due to the need for a full time executive of the university, Dr. Leodevico M. Fronza was appointed by the BOR as OIC in place of Dr. Quilang by virtue of BOR Res. No. 25 s.2011 effective September 26, 2011. The term of Dr. Fronza ended on April 1, 2012 when the University Board of Regents through a search committee headed by Dr. Saturnino M. Ocampo, a former CHED Commissioner finally affirmed Dr. Florentina S. Dumlao as NVSU President. Dr. Dumlao assumed office on April 2, 2012 by virtue of BOR Res. No. 26, s. 2012.

Under Dr. Dumlao's leadership, the development of the NVSU Five-Year Development Plan/Investment Plan (2012-2017) was prioritized to establish a clear direction for the university, building on the achievements of previous administrations. This new leadership aimed to align all university components effectively to achieve NVSU's ultimate vision, mission, and goals.

Dr. Andres Z. Taguiam assumed office as the third President of the university following the retirement of Dr. Dumlao. His leadership commenced on October 17, 2015, through Board Resolution No. 10-09-135, series of 2015. Renowned for his assertive nature, Dr. Taguiam consistently lobbied for financial support and approval of budget proposals from the Department of Budget and Management in the regional office. Additionally, he strengthened NVSU's partnerships with academic institutions in Thailand. Dr. Taguiam retired from government service on February 28, 2021, leading to the appointment of Hon. Ruth Raña Padilla by the Board of Regents and CHED as the OIC-President.

Under the stewardship of Hon. Ruth Raña Padilla, significant updates and improvements were made to university policies. Her leadership faced the formidable challenge of the pandemic, during which she successfully sustained university services through online portals and various flexible learning methods. Her tenure, from March 1, 2021, to September 7, 2022, as mandated by Board Resolution No. 85, series of 2021, saw NVSU advancing in academic excellence, research, extension activities, and accountable management. Despite her brief term, Hon. Padilla effectively prepared NVSU for its next President.

On September 8, 2022, through Board Resolution No. 78, series of 2022, Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. was appointed as the university's 4th President, marking a historic first as he rose from within the ranks of NVSU officials. During the Public Forum, Dr. Dumale outlined his eight developmental goals, setting a bold new direction for the university. His vision includes producing globally competitive graduates, fostering R&D community engagement, advancing technology commercialization, promoting internationalization, and enhancing administrative efficiency. His leadership is now paving the way for NVSU to build a good reputation in the global world.

As NVSU's history unfolds through diverse leaderships, dedicated staff, generations of students, and a tapestry of accolades, the university is poised to soar to new heights across borders.
